Carla Sharp, Professor PhD Personality Pathology Grows Up

- Classification Issues & Treatment



DPSP is honoured to present one of the world's leading capacities in classification & treatment related to developmental psychology and developmental psychopathology. Despite the fact that the diagnosis of personality disorder in youth is legitimized in psychiatric nomenclature (DSM 5, ICD-11) as well as national treatment guidelines, personality disorder is not routinely assessed for or treated in most child and mental health services.

This seminar will review the existing evidence base for BPD in adolescents, followed by a discussion and demonstration of evidence-based approaches to the assessment and treatment of BPD in adolescents, with a specific focus on the development of identity in adolescence and a mentalization-based approach to understanding and treating personality pathology.

Carla Sharp, PhD is Professor and Director of Training for the Clinical Psychology doctoral program at the University of Houston & Director of the Adolescent Diagnosis Assessment Prevention and Treatment Center and the Developmental Psychopathology Lab. She holds adjunct positions at University of Texas, Baylor College of Medicine, University College London and the University of the Free State in South Africa. She has a longstanding interest in social cognition as a cause and correlate of mental disorder across the lifespan with a special focus on youth. She has published over 240 peer reviewed publications, numerous chapters and books, including Social Cognition and Developmental Psychopathology and Handbook of Borderline Personality Disorder in Children and Adolescents. Her research uses Borderline and other personality pathology to study where social-cognitive function goes awry. Recent developments in her work reflect a translational focus to carry through the earlier focus on social cognition to evaluate its function as mechanism of change in personality pathology as well as other attachment-related conditions (orphans). Her work is influenced by mentalization-based approaches to scaffold interpersonal relationships and interactions between caregivers and youth. She is also currently exploring the metastructure of psychopathology to determine the cross-cutting value of social cognition in alternative models of personality pathology. Her work has been funded by the NICHD, NIAAA, NIMH, the Brain and Behavior Research Foundation and other foundations.
