

## ICD-11 Guidelines & Scientific Foundations Mental, Behavioral & Neurodevelopmental Disorders

*We have the extraordinary honor of presenting Prof. Geoffrey M Reed and Prof. Cary Kogan. This seminar will present an overview of key principles of ICD-11, provide in-depth knowledge about the new diagnostic guidelines for mental, behavioral & neurodevelopmental disorders, including an overview of the scientific foundations of the classification. The seminar will be highly relevant to assessment of psychopathology and the diagnosis of mental and behavioral disorders in everyday clinical practice regardless of the current diagnostic system in use.*

Since 2008 Senior Project Officer for the Revision of ICD-10 Mental and Behavioral Disorders at the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse at the World Health Organization. Manages activities related to the development of the chapters on Mental and Behavioral Disorders for ICD-11. Professor and Scientific Co-Director, Global Mental Health Program, Department of Psychiatry, Columbia University Medical Center, New York.

**Professor Cary Kogan:** Professor of Clinical Psychology, Director of Centre for Psychological Services and Research, University of Ottawa, Canada. Consultant to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, WHO on the development of the ICD-11 classification of Mental, Behavioral, and Neurodevelopmental Disorders, particularly involved in the reformulation of guidelines for Neurodevelopmental Disorders, Mood Disorders, Anxiety and Fear-Related Disorders, Obsessive-Compulsive and Related Disorders, and Disorders Due to Substance Use and Addictive Behaviors. Leading clinical field testing of the ICD-11 in Canada.
